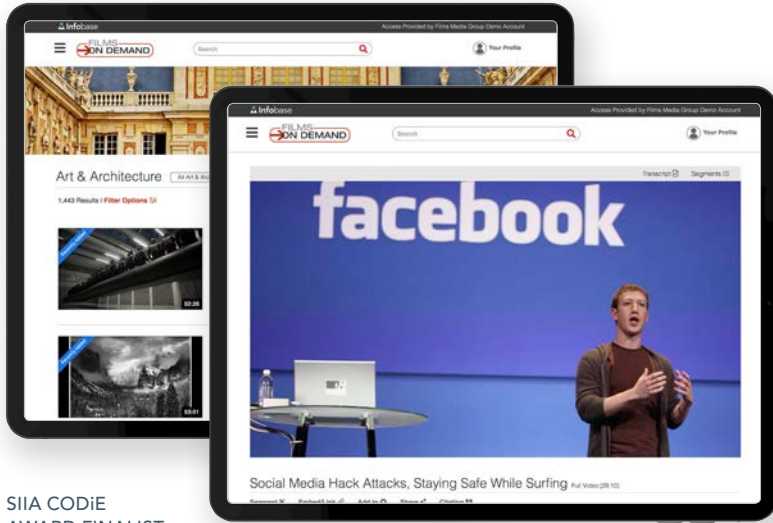

Geography

Journalist Simon Reeve investigates some of the most exotic and enticing locations on Earth in the series **Australia**; **Caribbean**; **Greece**; **Indian Ocean**; **Ireland**; **Sacred Rivers**; and **Tropic of Cancer**.

Health & Medicine

Warning: This Drug May Kill You—from journalist/producer/director Perri Peltz, this HBO documentary takes an unflinching look at the devastating effects of opioid addiction in the U.S., profiling four families whose lives tragically changed due to prescriptions of dangerous painkillers.

History

The Six Queens of Henry VIII—a four-part BBC series that takes an original and enlightening look at the real people at the center of the action during one of the most turbulent, passionate, and violent periods in English history.

Mathematics

Math: Linear Functions, Pythagoras’ Theorem, and Ratio and Proportion—a three-part series that will help students get their heads around this trio of foundational mathematics.

Music & Dance

The Heritage of Chinese Culture and Dance—with beautiful sights and sounds, this series provides a rare glimpse into Chinese culture through the introduction of seven representative dance forms.

Philosophy & Religion

Jesus and Islam—Jesus is also an exceptional character in the Quran. Why? And in what way? This seven-part series leads the investigation, along with the greatest scholars from around the world, and explores the emergence of Islam.

Physical Science
